INSPECTION NOTES

On Monday December 6, 2021 WorkSafeBC was notified of an incident at this workplace in which an explosion occurred in a fume hood in a chemistry lab resulting in injuries to a worker.

A meeting was conducted with the employer on Wednesday December 8, 2021 to gather further information and discuss conducting preliminary and full incident investigations.

This inspection report documents that the incident was reported to WorkSafeBC and provides information on the conducting of a preliminary and full incident investigation.

A) INCIDENT INVESTIGATIONS

Preliminary Investigation

As per section 71 of the *Workers Compensation Act* (the Act), the employer must immediately begin a preliminary investigation into this incident. The employer must ensure that a report of the preliminary investigation is prepared in accordance with WorkSafeBC Policy Item P2-71-1 RE: Preliminary Incident Investigation, Report and Follow-Up Action. The report must be completed within 48 hours of the occurrence of the incident.

The employer has completed the preliminary investigation and has provided WorkSafeBC with a copy of the report on December 8, 2021.

Full Investigation

Immediately after completing the preliminary investigation, the employer must undertake a full investigation in accordance with section 72 of the Act and submit a copy of their report to WorkSafeBC within 30 days of the occurrence of the incident. The employer must ensure that a report of the full investigation is prepared in accordance with WorkSafeBC Policy Item P2-72-1 RE: Full Incident Investigation, Report and Follow-Up Action.

NEXT STEPS

Provide a copy of the full investigation report to WorkSafeBC within 30 days of the occurrence of the incident to the secure link provided in a separate email.
