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INSPECTION NOTES

On Thursday February 23, 2023, OHO Jonathan Truefitt (this officer) conducted an inspection of this workplace pertaining to matters of compliance with the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation (the Regulation) and the *Workers Compensation Act* (the Act). The scope of the inspection was limited to a discussion on the reporting of unsafe conditions relating to indoor air quality and potable water quality.

This workplace is a tenant space within a large building located on the UBC Vancouver campus. This employer is the tenant in the space while the building is owned and managed by another entity.

A) REPORTING OF UNSAFE CONDITIONS AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

A number of health and safety concerns have been raised by workers at this workplace that were discussed with employer and worker representatives during the inspection. The employer reported that they are currently in the process of addressing the concerns which include but are not limited to:

- -Turbidity of the potable water supply to the workplace.
- -Indoor air quality related to odors in some areas of the building including the cafeteria.
- -Cleanliness of the washrooms that are used by the workers.
- -Odors and dripping water within the washrooms that are used by the workers.

The employer is reminded of the following:

- -Section 4.79(1)(a) of the Regulation which states that the employer must ensure that the indoor air quality is investigated when complaints are reported.
- -Section 3.10 of the Regulation which states that whenever a person observes what appears to be an unsafe or harmful condition or act the person must report it as soon as possible to a supervisor or to the employer, and the person receiving the report must investigate the reported unsafe condition or act and must ensure that any necessary corrective action is taken without delay.

It was discussed that the owner of this building has responsibilities under Section 25(a) of the Act which states that an owner must provide and maintain the owner's land and premises that are being used as a workplace in a manner that ensures the health and safety of persons at or near the workplace.

As this employer (who is a tenant) has the responsibility to address the unsafe acts and conditions reported to them (which relate to the building), and the owner has the responsibility to maintain the building in a manner that ensures the health and safety of persons at or near the workplace, a shared responsibility exists between the two parties.

Section 30 of the Act discusses "Responsibility when obligations apply to more than one person" (see Regulations Referenced).

Therefore, a joint responsibility by both the tenant (this employer) and the owner in regards to ensuring that corrective actions are completed exists, meaning that both parties would be expected to collaborate together in partnership to address the concerns.



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NEXT STEPS

As required by section 3.10 of the Regulation it is expected that the employer will ensure that any necessary corrective actions are taken without delay now that reports of unsafe conditions have been received from the workers.

It is understood that the employer may require the assistance of the building owner to address the concerns and implement corrective actions. Regular updates on the status of the correct actions are expected to be provided to workers in a timely manner.

There is a joint health and safety committee at this workplace that represents these workers. Information on the joint health and safety committee is available to workers from an online app. The employer may wish to provide a refresher to workers on where to access this app and the information on the joint health and safety committee.
