# **INSPECTION NOTES**

On April 27, 2023, I attended this worksite due to an incident which involved an injury to a worker and resulted in medical treatment. An employer representative and a worker representative participated in the inspection. It was reported there were approximately 85 workers from the injured worker's department present on site at the time of this inspection.

The following information was discussed (but not limited to):

#### I. INCIDENT

The following information is known about this incident:

- date and time of incident: April 27, 2023 at approximately 7:35 a.m.
- a worker fell into the access opening for a storm sump located outside the building
- the worker reported the incident to their supervisor who attended the scene
- the worker received first aid and was transported to hospital by the employer's first aid services

#### **II. PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION**

Employers are required to immediately investigate any incident that involves the following:

- Serious injury to a worker or a worker's death
- Injury requiring medical treatment
- Minor injury, or no injury, but had the potential for causing serious injury (Near Miss)
- Major structural failure or collapse
- Major release of hazardous substances

A preliminary investigation must be undertaken immediately and completed within 48 hours of an incident. The purpose of a preliminary investigation is to identify unsafe conditions, acts or procedures, as far as possible, in order to ensure that work can be done safely during the interim period between the incident and the conclusion of a full investigation. The employer representative told me the preliminary investigation had been initiated.

#### III. FULL INVESTIGATION (Employer Incident Investigation Report)

A full investigation (EIIR) must be undertaken after the preliminary investigation to identify the cause or causes of an incident. This means analyzing the facts to identify its underlying factors. This includes the underlying factors that made the unsafe condition, act or procedures possible and identify health and safety deficiencies in your firms' safety system or other management system.

#### **IV. NEXT STEPS**

a) By May 27, 2023, the employer must submit the full incident investigation report (EIIR) to the Board. Do not send the report directly to me. The EIIR can be submitted in one of the following ways:
