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#### **INSPECTION NOTES**

On February 2, 2024, prevention officer L. Gibbins was notified of an incident at this workplace. The officer spoke by phone, to two employer representatives ('the employer') regarding matters of compliance with the *Workers Compensation Act* (the Act) and the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation (the Regulation).

The following information was discussed:

#### I. INCIDENT

The following information is known about this incident:

- date of incident: Feb. 2, 2024
- a worker walked into their workplace,
- the worker slipped, fell, striking their head,
- there was no LoC, and
- the worker was transported by first responders to a nearby hospital for medical treatment.

#### II. PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION and FULL INVESTIGATION (Employer Incident Investigation Report)

The employer stated that a preliminary investigation was in progress and that a full incident investigation report (EIIR) will be completed and uploaded into the employer's portal within 30 days of the incident.

A preliminary investigation must be undertaken immediately and completed within 48 hours of an incident. The purpose of the preliminary investigation is to identify unsafe conditions, acts or procedures, as far as possible, in order to ensure that work can be done safely during the interim period between the incident and the conclusion of a full investigation.

A full investigation must be undertaken after the preliminary investigation to identify the cause or causes of an incident. This means analyzing the facts to identify its underlying factors. This includes the underlying factors that made the unsafe condition, act or procedures possible and identify health and safety deficiencies in your firms' safety system or other management system. A copy of the full investigation report must be submitted to WorkSafeBC within 30 days of the incident.

#### III. PLAN

The employer will submit a full incident investigation report (EIIR) for the incident into the employer's portal by March 2, 2024. The employer will also notify this officer in an email, that the EIIR was submitted by this date.

At the time of this inspection no violations of the Workers Compensation Act or the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation were cited. This decision relates only to this inspection date and location noted on this inspection report. A follow-up inspection may occur and/or a Notice of Compliance document may be required if order(s) are noted in a future inspection.
