INSPECTION NOTES

This report has been issued following a phone conversation with the employer representative (the employer) on March 4, 2024, regarding an incident that occurred on March 1, 2024 at this workplace.

The Workers Compensation Act (the Act) and the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation (the Regulation) were used as a basis for compliance.

BACKGROUND

On March 1, 2024, at approximately 8:00pm, a worker was loading a gas sterilizer when an ethylene oxide ampoule rolled of a bench and fell to the ground. The worker observed the ampoule was cracked. They left the room, called their supervisor and 911. Fire department responded. The worker sought medical assessment at a hospital and was later released.

The employer stated they have started investigation into the incident.

EMPLOYER INCIDENT INVESTIGATION

In accordance with sections 69 of the Act, an employer is required to undertake an investigation into any accident or incident that did not involve injury to a worker, or involved only minor injury not requiring medical treatment, but had a potential for causing serious injury to a worker.

A **preliminary investigation** must be undertaken immediately and completed within 48 hours of an incident. The purpose of the preliminary investigation is to identify unsafe conditions, acts or procedures, as far as possible, in order to ensure that work can be done safely during the interim period between the incident and the conclusion of a full investigation.

A **full investigation** must be undertaken after the preliminary investigation to identify the cause or causes of an incident. This means analyzing the facts to identify its underlying factors. This includes the underlying factors that made the unsafe condition, act or procedures possible and identify health and safety deficiencies in your firms' safety system or other management system. A copy of the full investigation report must be submitted to WorkSafeBC within 30 days of the incident.

NEXT STEPS

By March 5, 2024, the employer will provide a copy of their preliminary incident investigation report

The employer will complete and submit to WorkSafeBC a full incident investigation report (EIIR) by no later than April 1, 2024.

	The incident resulted in an injury that required immediate medical attention beyond the level of service provided by a first aid attendant, or injuries to several workers that require first aid. The incident resulted in a situation of continuing danger to workers, such as when the release of a chemical cannot be readily or quickly cleaned up.
